Root Canals in Charleston, WV

What Is a Root Canal?

A root canal is a treatment for the soft tissue inside your tooth, called the pulp, when it becomes infected or inflamed. Dr. Jane Smith gently removes the damaged pulp, cleans and disinfects the inside of the tooth, and seals it to guard against further problems. Despite its reputation, the procedure is designed to relieve pain rather than cause it, and it's carried out with anesthesia to keep you comfortable throughout. In most cases, a root canal lets you keep a tooth that would otherwise have to be pulled. Dr. Smith walks you through each step, so you always know what's happening and why.

Signs a Root Canal Is Right For You

Lingering Pain: Persistent tooth pain that lingers after eating or biting down often signals that the pulp inside your tooth is inflamed or infected and needs attention.

Temperature Sensitivity: Sensitivity to hot or cold that stays with you long after the food or drink is gone can be an early warning that the nerve inside the tooth is damaged.

Darkening Tooth: A tooth that has darkened or changed color compared to the ones around it may mean the inner tissue is dying and needs treatment to be saved.

Gum Swelling: Swelling, tenderness, or a small bump on the gums near a sore tooth can point to an infection that a root canal is designed to clear away.

Saved Tooth: Saving your natural tooth preserves your bite and keeps neighboring teeth from shifting, which protects your long-term oral health.

Pain Relief: Removing the infected pulp relieves the pain and pressure you've been living with, often bringing fast and lasting relief.

1 **Careful Exam:** Dr. Smith examines the tooth and takes digital images to see the shape of the roots and how far the infection has spread.

2 **Gentle Numbing:** We fully numb the area with local anesthesia so you stay comfortable and at ease before any treatment begins.

3 **Thorough Cleaning:** The damaged pulp is carefully removed, and the inside of the tooth is cleaned, disinfected, and shaped for its filling.

4 **Protective Seal:** We seal the tooth and plan any final restoration, such as a crown, to protect and strengthen it for years to come.

Does a root canal hurt?

Modern root canals are done with local anesthesia, so most patients feel little more than they would during a routine filling. The procedure actually relieves the pain caused by infection rather than adding to it.

How much does a root canal cost?

Does insurance cover a root canal?

How long does a root canal take?
